

Catholics worldwide have long recognized May as a month of fervent devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Pope Pius XII established the Feast of the Queenship of Mary on May 31 in his 1954 encyclical Ad Caeli Reginam, which contains these words: From the earliest ages of the Catholic Church, a Christian people, whether in time of triumph, or more especially in time of crisis, has addressed prayers of petition and hymns of praise and veneration to the Queen of Heaven and never has that hope wavered which they placed in the Mother of the Divine King, Jesus Christ; nor has that faith ever failed by which we are taught that Mary, the Virgin Mother of God, reigns with a mother's solicitude over the entire world, just as she is crowned in heavenly blessedness with the glory of a Queen.

So beautiful, moving, and powerful is this Marian devotion that today it has spread throughout the Catholic world. All acknowledge Mary as Our Mother and show gratitude for her countless intercessions before the Throne of Heaven.

It should come as no surprise then that Catholics naturally incorporate the secular holiday of Mother's Day into this month-long celebration. Just as Catholics honor the special role Mary played in salvation history, they join in honoring the special place of motherhood in the life of the Church and society. In an age when the family, including motherhood, is under frequent attack, Catholic society needs to highlight the important role mothers play in forming young Catholics, especially those who will go on to be our future priests and religious.
